Philippine manufacturing reached a record ₱4.29 trillion in gross value added in 2025, but the composition of growth points to a continuing structural gap. Expansion slowed to 3.6 percent and remained concentrated in food manufacturing, while many capital-intensive industries lagged overall manufacturing growth. From an industry policy perspective, this highlights the need to deepen the manufacturing base beyond consumption-led segments. Initiatives such as Tatak Pinoy and CREATE MORE provide an opportunity to rebalance growth by encouraging state-backed investment and scale in strategic, capital-intensive manufacturing. A deliberate, well-sequenced, state-backed industrial strategy that effectively uses these policies can help

reduce import dependence, strengthen domestic supply chains, and support more resilient long-term growth.

2. Closely monitoring Sta. Maria, Bulacan's ban on induction furnaces - By: FPI CE, Dr. Jesus Lim Arranza

When the Municipality of Sta. Maria, Bulacan enacted Ordinance No. 704 and its Implementing Rules and Regulations banning the use of induction furnaces in steelmaking, it sent a clear and commendable signal: environmental protection and consumer safety will no longer be subordinated to short-term industrial convenience.

This decisive action deserves recognition, which is why I recently wrote a letter to Mayor Omeng Ramos expressing our appreciation for his political will.

Induction furnaces, as currently used by certain operators, have long been associated with serious environmental harm—airborne emissions, dust, slag overflow, and water contamination. Worse, they enable the production of substandard steel products that threaten public safety and undermine legitimate manufacturers who comply with the law and invest in proper technology.

But passing an ordinance is only half the job. The real test of leadership lies in its immediate and strict implementation.

The urgency cannot be overstated. Sta. Maria's residents—ordinary citizens and taxpayers—have borne the brunt of pollution and environmental degradation for far too long. Protection of the environment and the welfare of the public cannot wait for another study, another extension, or another compliance roadmap that stretches years into the future.

In fact, even the Supreme Court recognizes the urgency to implement environmental protection laws. The SC's Rules of Civil Procedure explicitly prohibit trial courts and even the Court of Appeals from issuing injunctions that would stop the implementation of environmental laws and issuances. This is no accident. It reflects a national policy that environmental safeguards must be enforced without delay, precisely because environmental damage is often irreversible.

From the standpoint of industry, the Federation of Philippine Industries has been closely monitoring developments in Sta. Maria—particularly the enforcement actions against Hightension Industrial Corporation. We have learned that the company submitted a so-called Compliance Action Plan proposing a 24- to 36-month period to upgrade its facilities.

This proposal is plainly inconsistent with Ordinance No. 704 and its IRR. The law is clear: the use of induction furnaces is strictly prohibited, modernization must occur within six months from the IRR's effectivity, and failure to modernize within that period requires the dismantling or removal of the furnace from the factory.

3. National government presence needed at local level for agriculture success - By: Ernesto M. Ordoñez

MANILA, Philippines — Learning from experience, it is essential for some functions, national government personnel from the Department of Agriculture (DA) must be physically present at the local level to effectively support our Local Government Units (LGUs). This was suggested by the

Alyansa Agrikultura during the Jan. 26 Senate hearing on two bills sponsored by Sen. Francisco Pangilinan. They created the Philippine Agriculture and Fisheries Agency and the Bureau of Agriculture Cooperatives.

The principle of social subsidiarity is a cornerstone of good governance. It means that decisions should be made at the lowest possible level where the needs of the people are best known. The concept of a strong state is equally important. This means that the government should provide a definitive, unified, focused direction with the appropriate support.

Credibility

Pangilinan has high credibility in proposing these two bills. A Publicus Asia Philippines 2025 end-of-year survey measured how favorably respondents viewed sitting senators and newly elected ones. The top three most favored were Sens. Bam Aquino, Francisco Pangilinan and Risa Hontiveros. They advocated the most critical issues we face today: education, agriculture and good governance, respectively. This also reflects an awakening of a better-informed citizenry.

Pangilinan has both government and private sector experience. He was the Presidential Adviser on Food Security. After that, he put up his own small farm to experience agriculture from the small farmer's viewpoint. He saw two main problems: the lack of agricultural extension

and the absence of clustering and consolidation for economies of scale. In so doing, he humbly stated that he was building on the prior bills authored by Sen. Loren Legarda for extension and Sen. Hontiveros for cooperatives.

Extension

Because of the local government code, nationally directed agriculture extension services were devolved from the DA to the LGUs. The DA was allowed only regional offices, far from the action at the provincial and municipal levels. The majority of LGUs were not sufficiently prepared for this. In many cases, hiring was deficient, technology transfer was lacking and several extension workers were given non-extension work. The impact of this extension breakdown is devastating. An indicator is that while Vietnam and Thailand were way behind us before, our agricultural exports in 2024 were only \$8 billion, compared to Vietnam's \$62 billion and Thailand's \$52 billion.

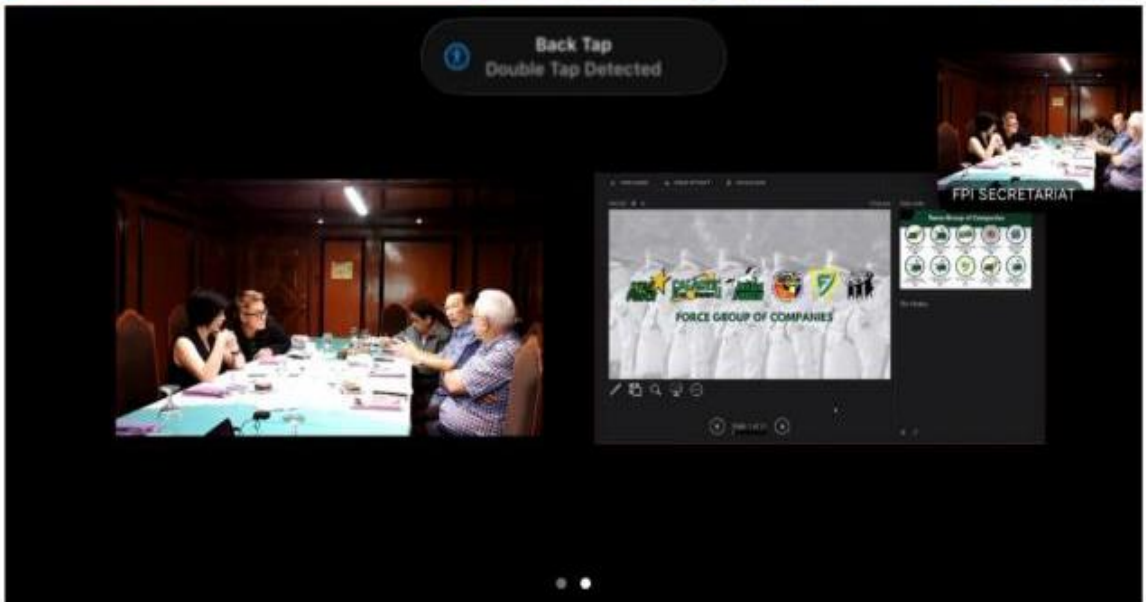
